

Additional duty on import of 22 items abolished

The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has abolished additional customs duty on the import of 22 items including synthetic organic tanning substances. The FBR has amended S.R.O.630(1)/2018 through an S.R.O.191(1)/2019 dated 11.02.2019 to be effective from 21st March'2019.

According to the notification, Additional Customs Duty would not be applicable on the import of toluene (Pakistan Customs Tariff heading 2902.3000), Butanone (methyl ethyl ketone) (PCT 2914.1200), other (PCT 2915.1290), - Other (PCT 2933.9990), - synthetic organic tanning substances (PCT 3202.1000), tanning substances, tanning preparations based on chromium sulphate (PCT 3202.9010), Other (PCT 3202.9090), disperse dyes and preparations based thereon (PCT 3204.1300), Other (PCT3207.1090), Other (PCT 3208.1090), Other (PCT 3208.9090), Mould release preparations (PCT 3403.9910), shoe adhesives (PCT 3506.9110), other (PCT 3812.3900), acrylic binders (PCT 3906.9020), - other (PCT 4005.1090), Other (PCT 4005.9900), machinery for making or repairing footwear (PCT 8453.2000), buttons (PCT 9606.2920) and other falling under the PCT heading 9606.2990.

Following is the text of the S.R.O.191(1)/2019 dated 11th February'2019 issued here on Tuesday:. – In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (5) of section 18 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), the Federal Government is pleased to direct that the following further amendment shall be made in its Notification No.S.R.O.630(1)/2018, dated the 24th May, 2018, namely: –

In the aforesaid Notification, -

(i) after clause (iii), the following new clause shall be inserted, namely:

"(iiia) import of goods classifiable under PCT codes 2902.3000, 2914.1200, 2915.1290, 2933.9990, 3202.1000, 3202.9010, 3202.9090, 3204.1100, 3204.1300, 3207.1090, 3208.1090, 3208.9090, 3403.9910, 3506.9110, 3506.9190, 3812.3900, 3906.9020, 4005.1090, 4005.9900, 8453.2000, 9606.2920 and 9606.2990;" and

(ii) in clause vii in sub-clause (c) after the words "Part VII, the words "and Part VIII" shall be added.

Meeting with Secretary Commerce held on 25.01.2019

PTA delegation comprising Mr. Agha Saiddain, Chairman, PTA, Mr. Mansoor Iqbal, Mr. Anjum Zafar and Mr. Azam Malik met Secretary Commerce, Mr. M. Younus Dagha to discuss anomaly in Mini Budget 2019 and requested to remove the Custom Duty of 11% on import of Stamping Foils which was already announced at '0' rated in Federal Budget 2018-19 under Part-III of the 5th Schedule of the Customs Act, 1969. The Secretary Commerce has assured to rectify the anomaly.

Salient Features of the Mini Budget announced on 23.01.2019

- 1. 20% tax on banks profit for SMEs from 39%.
- 2. Agricultural loan tax 20% from 39%.
- 3. Qarza e Hasna for Home Developers.
- 4. Withholding Tax abolished on Cash Withdrawal for Filers.
- 5. Import tax 6% full & final and no minimum anymore.
- 6. Non filers can buy cars upto 1300cc.
- 7. Withholding Tax statements will be filed half yearly instead of monthly.
- 8. Tax for small marriage lawns upto 500 sqft 5000 from 20000.
- 9. Duty waived on import of news prints.
- 10. Small industries are incentives.
- 11. Plant and machinery for green projects, complete tax waiver.
- 12. No super tax on non banking company.
- 13. No tax on retain earning.
- 14. Advance tax on purchase and sale of shares is completely abolished 0%.
- 15. Carry forward of capital loss is allowed for 3 years.
- 16. Negotiable instruments/promissory notes against refunds.
- 17. Duty increase on luxury cars.
- 18. Duty increase on Stamping Foils 3212.1000 at 11%.

OUTCOME OF THE MEETING HELD WITH ADVISOR ON COMMERCE MINISTER ON 15.01.19 AT ISLAMABAD BY MR. AZAM MALIK, MEMBER, EXPORT/DLTL/TAXES STRATEGIC STANDING COMMITTEE, PTA

As nominated by the Chairman, PTA, Mr. Azam Malik, Senior Member, PTA attended the meeting held with Mr.Abdul Razak Dawood, Advisor on Commerce & Textile on 15th January'2019 at Islamabad to discuss following pending issues of Leather Industry:

- 1. To release of Pending Sales Tax refunds and DLTL Cases for which the Advisor on Commerce confirmed that by end of the month of January'2019 all pending Refunds claims of Leather Industry will be cleared approx. 1/3rd will be paid in cash by end of this month and 2/3 will be paid by promissory Note by end of Feb.
- 2. The tenure and rate of interest is still to be fixed. This bond will be saleable as well.
- 3. To allow regular department of Lahore to release refund claims. The Advisor on Commerce replied that a new frame work to settle the refunds is being worked out very soon and all refunds will be paid directly by State Bank to our accounts without involving any other department.
- 4. To reduce duty on import of Chemicals for leather industry. The Advisor on Commerce assured PTA that they are considering it very seriously and soon we will know the outcome in Mini Budget.
- 5. To include Finished / Dyed Leather in DLTL Order, 2018 for which he already agreed with PTA's proposal. Unfortunately he did not give any definite answer on that. I again pleaded strongly that it must be considered and it is a high value added product and must be added in DLTL programme. He agreed to review this in March which means PTA still have to follow this proposal.

Conclusion:

Mr. Abdul Razak Dawood was very aggressive, strong and extremely positive to lift the export.

The Advisor said after settlement of all current problems of Leather Industry he will call PTA again to discuss leather value added product, he mentioned categorically that he wants ladies leather bag industry and ladies shoes industry to grow in Pakistan and for that Ministry of Commerce will go all out to help leather industry. He considers our leather industry has good potential to grow and carries good image of PTA.

OUTCOME OF THE MEETING HELD WITH THE ADVISOR ON COMMERCE & TEXTILE ON 12.01.2019 VIA VIDEO LINK

Mr. Agha Saiddain, Chairman, PTA participated in the meeting arranged on very short notice received on phone from the office of the Advisor on Commerce on 12th January'2019 in PTA Northern Zone Office, Lahore and Ministry of Commerce, Islamabad simultaneously via Video Conference. Mr. Abdul Razak Dawood presided over the meeting. The meeting was also attended by the representatives of the Pakistan Chemical Manufacturers Association who had some reservations on PTA's recommendations for reduction in duties on various chemicals.

However, the Chairman, PTA strongly explained PTA's genuine demand for reduction in duty on some tanning chemicals. The Advisor on Commerce & Textiles agreed with PTA's proposal and assured to resolve the issue of Leather Industry.

MEETING WITH MR. SHAUKAT ZAMAN, DIRECTOR (TRADE), PBS HELD ON 28.12.2018 AT PBS-KARACHI

A meeting of PTA Delegation was held with Mr. Shaukat Zaman, Director (Trade) in Pakistan Bureau of Statistics in his office at Karachi which was attended by Mr. Hamid Arshad Zahur and Sheikh Afzal Hussain to discuss the serious issue of unit price of leather and after threadbare discussion it was agreed with consensus to work out more deeply on the statistics obtained by delegation from PBS for submission of summary of calculation with proposed destination to have 2nd round of meeting shortly to finalise the understanding between PTA AND PBS to make it precisely to the actual extend under the prevailing unit price of leather in international market as the point was raised to determine actual unit price of leather in last CEC meeting.

During the meeting it was revealed that PBS does not have any way of verifying the data as provided by customs/fbr... The values seem to be ok, but major error is seen in unit price and total units, as reported by PBS in sqm.

The meeting was concluded by deciding to run a test case on exports to 3 - 5 specific countries, based on individual HS Codes and work with PBS to see if the data they have is really authentic?

MEETING OF PTA DELEGATION WITH SECRETARY COMMERCE ON 20.12.2018

PTA Delegation led by Mr. Agha Saiddain, Chairman, PTA accompanied by Khawaja Muhammad Mehr Ali, Vice Chairman, PTA (central) and Mr. Azam Malik, Senior Member, PTA met with Secretary Commerce, Mr. Muhammad Younas Dagha and discussed the reasons for declining in export of Leather Sector in general and finished leather in particular. The Chairman, PTA also delivered a comprehensive presentation on the Leather Industry on power point to draw attention of the Secretary Commerce on core issues of the Leather Industry as follows:

- To included Finished Leather / Dyed Leather value added product in SRO 711(I)/2019 dated 08.06.2018 and continue to allow 4% Drawback of on export of Finished/Dyed Leather for the year July-June 2017-18, 2018-19 & 2019-2020.
- To remove requirement of Certificate on import of Hides/Skins Raw and Wetblue imposed under SRO 1067(I)/2017 dated 26.10.2017.
- To withdraw Custom Duty / Sales Tax on import of Tanning Machines.
- To allow Matching grant for setting-up Treatment Plants as allowed in STPF 2009-12.
- To allow Duty Drawback Rates on Finished leather as was recommended by IOCO after 3-years working instead of reduced rates as notified by the FBR vide its SRO 923(I)/2015 dated 08.09.2015.
- To allow withdrawal of additional regulatory duty on import of basic chemicals as imposed under SRO 1135(I)/2017 dated 16.10.2017.
- To increase subsidy on participation in Int'l Fairs and Exhibitions.
- To revised SR0 578 (I)/2016 dated 01.07.2016 for Government subsidy on import of 24 Tanning Machines.
- To remove 3% Custom Duty on import of Finished Leather.
- To finalize FTA with Japan/South Korea, China and other Countries.
- To grant 75% subsidy on international lab testing of Finished Leather.
- To release of 2.5% pending DLTL FY 2017-18.
- To allow level playing field to Leather Sector Industry of Pakistan.
- To expedite release of pending Duty Drawback Claims from Lahore Collectorate.

The Sr. Vice Chairman, PTA participated in the Business Community Meeting held on 9th December'2018 in Governor House, Karachi presided over by the Prime Minister of Pakistan

Mr. Kamran Habib, Sr. Vice Chairman, PTA (Central) participated in the Meeting of the Business Community held in Governor House on 09.12.2018 which was presided over by the Prime Minister of Pakistan, Mr. Imran Khan Niazi to discuss trade issues with the business community.

Mr. Kamran Habib have the opportunity to present the following issues of leather industry to the PM for resolution and favourable consideration to provide more viable level playing field to this 2nd biggest export oriented Industry of the country for fetching precious foreign exchange for the country:

• To include Dyed/Finished Leather with 6 related H.S. codes already submitted to MOC in June'2017 vide PTA's letter in the DLTL scheme for the year 2018–21. A detailed presentation made to MOC and available with them.

• Rather than to consider to announce "Bonds" in US\$ or Euro to International market with the payment of "Advance Interest" which could be around 10-12%, which is really exorbitant/detrimental to the economy. We proposed during the meeting to consider to offer necessary incentives, which could be around 5%-7% in comparison to the Advance interest percentage to the core export Industries including Leather Sector of Pakistan, which have great potential for further acceleration/exploration of business avenues for the supreme motive to yield the sizeable foreign exchange in terms of US\$ or Euro's.

On PTA instance, PM has directed during the meeting to form a "syndicate / Advisory Committee" with the representation of all allied Government Ministries/Departments concerned specially a representative from Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Finance, FBR, Ministry of Industries & Production and from our Association (PTA) with necessary empowerment to sort the issues for this vibrant Industry of the country, so that all ongoing issues for the export Industries would be resolved immediately for the desired goals.


